Glimpse of God's Character

Mark 6:48 – “Jesus saw them (disciples) being battered as they rowed, because the wind was against them. Around three in the morning He came toward them walking on the sea and wanted to pass by them.”

I love meditating on this final statement in verse 48. Why did Jesus want to pass by them?

“It’s hard to remember that Jesus did not come to make us safe, but rather to make us disciples.” —Stanley Hauerwas, Duke University

Come to think of it, what prepares us more as Christ followers: relaxing, counting our seashells and munching on manna or battling the storms in life?

But the question still remains, after hours of battling the storm, why did Jesus want to pass by them? Was it that He hoped they would be encouraged if they just saw a glimpse of Him or did He omnisciently foresee the disciples surviving the storm?

I do not think we can definitively know the answer, however, we know God’s character states that He is always with us. He leads us in green pastures, beside quiet waters, guides in the paths of righteousness, and walks us through the valley of the shadow of death. Even though the storm feels overwhelming, **God is with us... always!**
